UNIFORM

As we enter Spring the weather outside is still frosty, Please ensure students come to school with a warm coat and suitable plain black shoes. The expectation is that students are always in the correct full school uniform.

Students are required to wear their uniform correctly at all times while in school but also when travelling to and from the school since students represent us in the wider community during those times.

We do have some preloved school uniform available. Please speak to the office if you are interested .

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

You may be eligible for Free School Meals, please read the information below on eligibility criteria and use this <u>link</u> to apply. It is really helpful to the school that you claim if you are eligible, as it gives additional funding to the school and not just for the period you are eligible, but also for a number of years afterwards if you have been in receipt of Free School Meals for long enough.

If you receive one of the following benefits then you could be eligible for free school meals worth over £390 per child per year:

- · Income Support
- · Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- · Income-related Employment Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with a taxable income of no more than £16,190 and not in receipt of Working Tax Credit*
- · Pension Credit (Guarantee Credit)
- · NASS support (The National Asylum Support Service)
- · Child Tax Credit provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- · Working Tax Credit— for the four weeks after employment ends
- · Universal Credit—provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400
