Total catch-up budget:	£8,821					
Guidance	The catch-up premium is funded on a per pupil basis at £80 per pupil. This will be based on the previous year's census and will not include Nursery numbers, meaning St Monica's Catholic Primary School should receive £8,800. The spending of this money will be down to schools to allocate as they see best. To support schools to make the best use of this funding, the Education Endowment Foundation has published a support guide for schools with evidence-based approaches to catch up for all students.  Covid-19 has impacted on all our lives. We also need to be mindful that many pupils have not been in school since March and the impact that this will have had on both their education, emotional wellbeing and readiness to learn.
