
PE & Sport Premium Funding Proposal 2020/21

The 2019/20 academic year proved to be challenging in many ways, not least of which is the ability of our pupils to access swimming lessons. To address this lapse, our PE providers - Challenge Sports and Education – have introduced non-contact games to increase the scope of our provision.

We have also given the providers the go-ahead to secure a PE Quality mark which will validate all the hard work put in by both staff and pupils in ensuring a provision that is fit for purpose and beneficial to children.

Key indicator 1: The engagement of <u>all</u> pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school

- Challenge Education and Sports to ensure that **all** children fully engage in high quality PE and sports for at least 2 full hours each week.
- All pupils to develop increased stamina for PE

Key indicator 2: The profile of Physical Education, School Sport and Physical Activity (PESSPA) being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement

Challenge Education and sports will work towards a PE Quality Mark to improve the provision across the school and raise the profile.

Coaches will develop opportunities for cross-curricular links, including development of vocabulary in all lessons

Key indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

Staff knowledge and ability will be developed through increased active performance of teaching and classroom support staff through team teaching by the professional coaches. We expect to empower all teachers to be confident to deliver PE in their classrooms.

Key indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

Coach to expedite the Introduction of 'elite' and 'unorthodox' sports such as Cricket, Hockey and other non-contact games which enable social distancing

Key indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport

Competitive cross-school events were cancelled from the Spring term of 2019/20 to 2020/21 Autumn term. We will be ready to meaningfully engage once the ban is lifted.
