A warm welcome to everyone. I hope that you had a good break and that you managed to relax, have fun and enjoy the time off school. We started the term positively, with a busy year ahead. We are looking forward to getting to know our new friends, their talents and skills, so that they can be full participants of school life. As part of our Vision Assembly on Friday, we reflected on the importance of our school Vision and Mission and how we can all work together in order to achieve this in our day to day lives.

Staffing We are delighted to welcome new staff to the St Monica's team this year:

• Our new teacher, Mr Pieter Oberholzer in Year 6 and Ms Christine Hodge, our new Office Manager.

St Monica's is a place to grow and staff move into new roles as they develop. This year, Ms Rodrigues and Mrs. Jenny Vaughan join the Senior Management Team, bringing their skills to the team, and Mrs. Vaughan is now a qualified Assistant SENCo.

Free School Meals - Starting from September, the Mayor of London is offering free meals to all pupils from Reception to Year 6. To help all parents with the cost of living crisis, we will also provide free meals to all Nursery and Pre-School pupils. We will continue to provide healthy, nutritious and balanced menu to all our pupils. Please check the school website for the termly menu. The Mayor's free meals is different to the national free school meal program. If you are on an income-related benefit, you may qualify for additional support, including supermarket vouchers during holidays. Please see Page 4 for information on this scheme.

Let's do 2023-2024! School starts at 8.55am for all pupils, with the playground open and supervised from 8.40am. Toddlers finish school at 3pm and Rec-Y6 at 3.20pm. Good punctuality and an attendance of at least 96% are minimum expectations.

At St Monica's, our pupils meet the high expectations we set for them, such as taking responsibility for being prepared for their learning. This includes:

- correct and labelled uniform both full school uniform and PE uniform
- healthy snacks and packed lunches (if you decide not to take the free school meal).

Communication—We use Class Dojo as our main tool for communication. We do kindly ask that you allow up to 5 working days for staff to respond to individual queries. We do our best to answer sooner, however sometimes that is not possible. If there is an urgent issue, please contact us via the School Office on 02077395824.

Uniform Policy

Uniform is an important part of a school's identity. It reinforces who we are as a community and enables students to feel pride in their school. It also helps prepare students for life after school where many will have to dress smartly for work.

The uniform policy is available on the website for further reference.

<u>Coat – ideally plain blue or black (no denim, leather, quilted shirts or hoodies).</u>

St Monica's book bag or rucksack.

Nail varnish or jewelry — This must not be worn for school. Items of jewelry which are not in line with the policy will be confiscated. If ears are already pierced, only one small, plain gold or silver-coloured stud (no jewels) may be worn in each ear lobe.

<u>Hair</u> – should not be outlandish in style or colours. Mohican cuts and lines are not permitted. Please do not cut these styles for your children.

<u>PE</u> – Please refer to the school policy – White logo shirt – Navy blue shorts or jogger bottoms.

Footwear: No boots, canvas shoes or trainer style shoes are permitted, including branded sports makes including (but not limited to) Nike, Adidas, Reebok, Converse, Stan Smiths and Vans.

As we return in September, staff will check the uniform of all pupils. Any students not in the correct uniform will receive a letter. If you have any questions about the guidance, please do not hesitate to contact school or refer to the uniform policy on the website. If you are unsure whether a piece of uniform is acceptable, please consult the school before buying. If there are any extenuating circumstances, which mean you are unable to meet the uniform requirements by Monday 19th September, please email: office@st-monicas.hackney.sch.uk.

Free School Meal Status/Vouchers

The National Free School Meals (FSM) is different from the new Mayor of London's free schools for all primary school pupils.

Schools get extra funding, known as the 'Pupil Premium', for every child registered as eligible for FSM if their parents are receiving benefits. Schools use this money for various activities to support their pupils.

Please note only children Registered as eligible for FSM are entitled to school holiday supermarket vouchers.

Swearing-in



To be eligible, you need to be in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with a taxable income of no more than £16,190 and not in receipt of Working Tax Credit
- Pension Credit (Guarantee Credit)
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit, Housing Benefit, or Council Tax Benefit (not including second adult rebate)
