Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI passed away on the 31st December 2022. Please join us in prayers of thanksgiving for his life of faith, and for the repose of his soul. May he rest in peace and rise in glory.

Wednesday 1st February was the Feast Day of one of our class saints, St Brigid. She is also known as Brigid of Ireland or the 'mother saint' of Ireland. According to tradition she was born in 451AD and died in 525AD. She was believed to have been an abbess who founded several convents of nuns, most notably that of Kildare, which was one of the most important in Ireland . She is patroness of many things, including poetry, learning, healing, protection, blacksmithing, livestock and dairy production. It is believed if you hung a St Brigid cross in your home it protected it from fire. Did you know that from this year, St Brigid's Day is a public holiday in Ireland, the first to be named after a woman? This took place on Monday 6th February.

You will be aware of the impact of the teachers strike that is taking place next month. The school will continue to keep a close eye on the guidance and information from the teaching unions, the Department for Education and Hackney Education; and keep you updated.

Children's Mental Health Week takes place this year from Monday 6th To Friday 10th February. The theme this year is 'Let's Connect'. This is of course a very important aspect of our children's development as we know that happy children learn better and make better progress. We will be working closely with WHAMS and our team to ensure we continue the good work we already do in supporting our children's mental health.


