We also warmly congratulate our new pupil leaders for this academic year. They will be fantastic ambassadors for our school community and we are excited to see them flourish in their roles.

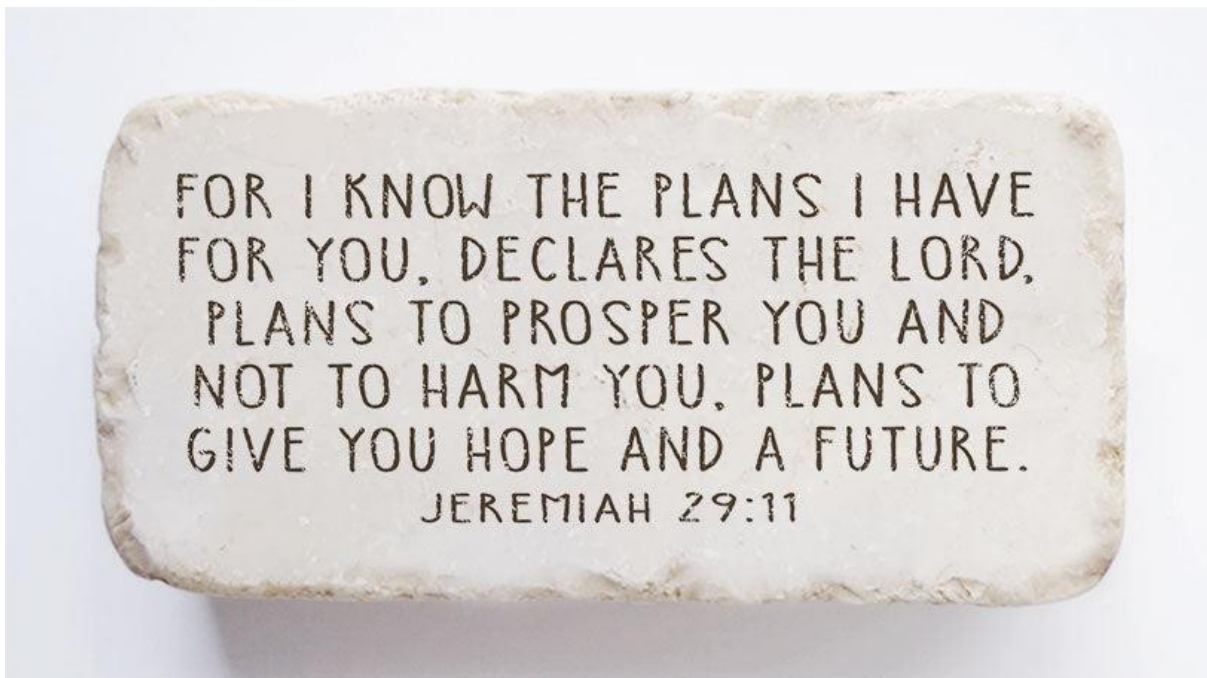
If you would like to be more involved, we are now inviting parents to sign up as Class Representatives. You can sign up at the School Office, and our first Class Rep meeting will take place on Wednesday, 1st October 2025, at 9am. Mrs Coley will be representing the school at these meetings, and we encourage you to get involved.

A few important reminders for this term:

- Like last year, children are not allowed to bring **smartphones** or **smartwatches** to school
- **Breakfast Club:** 8:30–9:00am, charged at £2.50 per session.
- **After-School Enrichment Clubs:** £35 per 6-week block.
- **Extended Day Provision:** £20 per hour.
- No clubs will run during the first week back in September.
- **Class Dojo** will remain our main communication platform. However, private messaging will be disabled. To discuss concerns or queries, please contact the school office directly. The school will determine the most appropriate communication method and designate the appropriate staff member to respond.

- **Personal Equipment:** Children in Years 1–6 may bring their own pencil cases containing: HB pencils, colouring pencils, a green pen, a purple pen, a small ruler, an eraser, and a glue stick. Pupils are expected to take responsibility for their personal items.
- **School Gates:** From September, the Hoxton Street (KS1) entrance will be the sole point of entry. Gates will open at 8:50am.
- If you need to discuss your child's **progress or raise a concern**, please follow the correct steps:
 1. Speak with your class teacher first.
 2. If needed, speak to your Phase Leader:
 - EYFS and KS1: Ms Rodrigues
 - KS2: Mr O
 3. Book an appointment with the Head of School.
 4. Finally, you may request a meeting with the Executive Head if necessary.
- Thank you for your ongoing support and understanding in helping us maintain strong communication and a positive learning environment.
